Emergency Pool Rules 2020

1. COVID Guidelines

- a. The main pool will be open weekdays from 12:30 pm – 8:00 pm and weekends from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm, weather and conditions permitting.**
- b. Reservations and a Waiver of Liability are required. No one is allowed to enter the pool without a reservation.**
- c. General swimming will be permitted in one of six lanes in 45 minutes sessions. Pool keys will be required upon check in.**
- d. Only residents of the immediate member's household will be allowed to use the facility. Guests are prohibited.**
- e. Sycamore Patch swimmers, children between the ages of 8 and 14 without his/her parents, will not be allowed this season.**
- f. Family groups or individual lap swimmers will occupy one designated lane area and will be expected to maintain adequate social distance from the swimmers in nearby areas. A monitor on deck will assist and swimmers are expected to follow the instructions given.**
- g. Restrooms will be available. Sanitization will be provided.**
- h. The following areas will be closed (off limits): deck area, lawn, furniture, baby pool, diving board, deep end, shallow end (except for entry/exit), changing areas, showers, drinking fountain, trellis area and barbeques.**
- i. Swimmers will be asked to exit the facility promptly at the end of their session.**
- j. Lifeguards and COVID Monitors on duty are in charge of the pool and are required to enforce these rules.**
- k. Persons having a communicable disease, diarrhea, open sores or skin infections will not be permitted to enter the pool.**
- l. These rules are subject to change at the discretion of the SHA board.**

2. General Rules

- a. The lifeguard on duty is in charge of the pool and is required to enforce these rules. Lifeguard instructions will be obeyed promptly, but may be appealed to the On-site Manager or to the Board of Directors. Any person failing to obey instructions from the lifeguard will be required to leave the pool area and may be suspended from the premises.
- b. When expulsion is resisted, illegal activity is observed or when behavioral problems are uncontrollable, the lifeguard on duty will be required to contact the Danville Police Department or the Association's security company. If a disturbance is created at the facilities such that law enforcement is summoned, banishment from the pool area for the entire summer will be enforced.
- c. At a long blast of the lifeguard's whistle, all persons will remain in their assigned lane until assisted by the monitor to exit the pool.
- d. A short blast of the lifeguard's whistle indicates a hazardous condition. Look at the lifeguard or monitor!
- m. Swimmers must wear customary bathing attire. No cut-offs/street clothes are allowed.
- n. Swim diapers must be worn by all infants. Plastic pants over swim diapers are strongly encouraged.
- o. The following acts are prohibited:
 1. Running on the pool deck
 2. Food, gum, pop-top or glass containers on the pool deck
 3. Conduct hazardous to oneself or others, such as wrestling, ducking, chicken fights, pushing or throwing others into the pool including the use of inappropriate language
 4. Spitting and gum chewing while swimming
 5. Balls, frisbees and other items that can be thrown
 6. Sitting or hanging on the lane ropes
 7. Playing on the ladders
 8. Unnecessary conversation with the lifeguard or loitering near the lifeguard stand
 9. Pretending to drown or being in need of rescue attention
 10. Smoking (Town of Danville Code 7-2.4)
